- 1. Read 2 Peter 1:1-2. How does the author identify himself and his recipients?
- 2. Read 2 Peter 1:3-11. What has God given us so that we might live righteously? What does righteous living look like?
- 3. Read 2 Peter 1:12-21. What goal does Peter have in the writing of this letter? What experiences and teaching in his past are motivations for him now? (See also John 21:18-19.)
- 4. Read all of chapter 2. Peter describes in detail the rebellious. Why would he find it necessary to write regarding their behavior and final end? How might it be encouraging or helpful to his readers?
 - What does he call them? (v. 1, 10, 17)
 - What do they do? (v. 1-3, 10-15, 18-19)
 - What is their end? (v. 3, 12-16, 19)
 - What proof does Peter give to reinforce the guarantee of this outcome? (v. 4-9)
 - What final warning does Peter give to a particular kind of sinner? (v. 20-22)
- 5. Read 2 Peter 3:1-10. What is the goal of his letter? What does he want them to recall and/or understand? Why?
- 6. Read 2 Peter 3:11-18. Who does Peter say believers should be? Why? What is some practical advice he gives to accomplish this?
- 7. Reflect over these last three lessons on the life and writings of Peter. What is a truth about God that you have learned or been reminded of?
