Lesson 11
Acts 9:32-10:48

1. Read Acts 9:32-43. How was Peter able to heal Aeneas and raise Tabitha (Dorcas) from the dead? How did God use these miracles? What do they teach us about God?
2. Where did Peter stay in Joppa? Why would this have been unusual? (Lev. 11:24-40)
3. Read Acts 10:1-8. Who was Cornelius? What kind of man was he? How did he respond to the vision from God he received?
4. What possible reasons did God have for the dietary laws concerning clean and unclean animals for the Jews? (Lev. 11, 20:25-26) Why were they no longer necessary? (Matt. 5:17, Mark 7:1-23)
5. Read Acts 10:9-23. How did God prepare Peter to take the gospel to Cornelius? What new truth did Peter have to learn? (Eph. 2:11-22)
6. Read Acts 10:24-33. What attitudes expressed by Cornelius and his friends should we emulate?
7. Read Acts 10:34-43. List key points in Peter's message to Cornelius and his friends. How are these particularly appropriate in witnessing to non-Christians with little or no religious background (as the Gentiles in Peter's day)?
8. Read Acts 10:44-48. What was the result of Peter's sermon? If Philip was in Caesarea (Acts 9:40), why did God use Peter and not Philip to share the gospel with Cornelius?
