Lesson 19
Acts 18:1-28

1. Read Acts 18:1-5. Remember Paul is a man of great faith, but he is still a man. Try to put yourself in Paul's place. Why might he have been discouraged when he arrived in Corinth? Have you ever had similar feelings for the same reason?
2. How did God encourage him shortly after he arrived? (vs. 1-5, 2 Cor 11:9)
3. Who were Priscilla and Aquila? Why were they in Corinth?
4. Read Acts 18:6-11. How did the opposition from the Jews in Corinth lead Paul to a new opportunity and new encouragement?
5. There will be opposition in all faithful ministry and witness by Christians. What is our role and what is God's role in bringing others to faith?
6. Read Acts 18:12-18a. How were God's promises to Paul (v. 10) clearly fulfilled while Paul was in Corinth?
7. Thinking back over Paul's experiences in Corinth, what principles can be an encouragement to us today?
8. Read Acts 18:18-22. Paul ends his second missionary journey with travels of over a 1000 miles. Look at a map and follow his path. What major new ministry was begun on his way back? (vv. 19-21)
9. Read Acts 18:23-28. Paul's 3rd journey begins in verse 23, but in the meantime things were happening in Ephesus. Who was Apollos? What is said about his knowledge of Scripture, his enthusiasm, the help he received from Aquila and Priscilla, his preaching and the value of his ministry? Think about how each of those five things apply to all Christians including us?
