Last week – we ended by looking at an ancient Roman letter – this week we have an actual account of the drama taking place in an ancient Roman courtroom, and the political intrigue of that time.

1. Read Acts 24:1-9. Who came to finally press charges against Paul? Who was missing that should have been there? (Also vs. 19-20) Why do you think they were absent?

- 2. What charges were brought against him? Was there any validity to them? If so, what?
- 3. Read Acts 24:10-22. How did Paul respond to each of these charges?
- 4. Tertullus, the prosecuting attorney, described Paul as *a ringleader of the Nazarene sect*. How did the early Christians see themselves in regard to the Jewish faith?
- 5. Read Acts 24:23-27. What did Felix decide to do about Paul? Why? What motivated his treatment of Paul?
- 6. What the three points did Paul make in his discourse with Felix and Drusilla? (v. 25) How did Felix respond? How did he increase his own guilt before God?
- 7. How are Felix and Drusilla representative of many people today? (2 Corinthians 6:1-2)
