	4. Why is Saul's conversion an encouragement to every sinner?
	5. Who was Ananias? What lessons do you learn from God's call to him and his reaction to it?
	6. What two verses in Chapter 9 summarize God's purposes for Saul's life? From what you know of Paul and his life, how were they fulfilled? In what way do all Christians have a similar call of their lives?
	7. Using all of these accounts, try to list the events of Saul's life after his conversion in order. Why was it necessary for him to go to Arabia? How might this apply to you?
	8. What opposition did he face and why? Why do you think Saul persevered? Who came alongside to support him in Jerusalem?
